

Terms of Use

PLEASE READ THESE TERMS OF USE ("AGREEMENT" OR "TERMS OF USE") CAREFULLY BEFORE USING THE SERVICES OFFERED BY THE INSTITUTE OF ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONICS ENGINEERS, INCORPORATED ("IEEE"). THIS AGREEMENT SETS FORTH THE LEGALLY BINDING TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR YOUR USE OF THE WEBSITE AT [HTTP://TECHRXIV.ORG](http://TECHRXIV.ORG) (THE "SITE") (OR WHEN MADE AVAILABLE IN CONNECTION WITH ADDITIONAL IEEE PRODUCTS OR SERVICES THE "SERVICE"). BY USING THE SERVICE IN ANY MANNER, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO VISITING OR BROWSING THE SITE, YOU AGREE TO BE BOUND BY THIS AGREEMENT. IF YOU DO NOT AGREE TO ALL THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT, YOU SHOULD NOT USE THE SERVICE. THIS AGREEMENT APPLIES TO ALL USERS OF THE SITE OR SERVICE.

1. **Acceptance of Terms.** The Service is offered subject to acceptance without modification of all of the terms and conditions contained herein (the "Terms of Use"), which includes the IEEE Privacy Policy as well as the IEEE Policies, IEEE Code of Ethics, IEEE Code of Conduct, IEEE Publication Services and Products Board Operations Manual, and all application IEEE policies and procedures. - C. You shall not:
 - i. take any action that imposes or may impose (as determined by IEEE in its sole discretion) an unreasonable or disproportionately large load on IEEE's (or its third party providers') infrastructure;
 - ii. interfere or attempt to interfere with the proper working of the Service or any activities conducted on the Service;

18. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of New York. You understand and agree that the state of New York shall have exclusive jurisdiction in resolving all disputes.
19. Integration and Severability. The Terms of Use are the entire agreement between you and IEEE with respect to the Site and use of the Service, and supersede all prior or contemporaneous communications and proposals (whether oral, written or electronic) between you and IEEE with respect to the same. If any provision of the Terms of Use is found to be unenforceable or invalid, that provision will be limited or eliminated to the minimum extent necessary so that the Terms of Use will otherwise remain in full force and effect and enforceable.
